

Legislative Process: How It Works



Covid-19 Protocols

- Main Capitol Building open, testing provided for free.
- Public enters via North entrance
- Mask required at all times

House

- Face masks required at all times
- Individual members' offices set guidelines at their discretion.

Senate

- Negative Covid-19 tests required to enter a committee hearing or gallery
- Gallery seating limited



Texas State Capitol Building Covid-19 Protocols

Main Capitol (including rotunda, extension, and hallways)

- Main Capitol Building will be open to the public, however, negative Covid-19 tests are required for entry. Testing results take approximately 15 minutes and tests are free to the public.
- . The public can only enter via the north door of the Capitol.
- · A mask is required to be worn at all times.

House

- Face masks will be required for all persons on the House floor, gallery, and in committee hearings. Speakers may remove masks to talk at front and back mics.
- Individual members' offices will have the discretion to set their own guidelines for their offices. Some will only require a mask, some will be by invitation-only, and some will require a negative Covid-19 test for admission.

Senate

- Members of the public are required to have a wristband demonstrating a negative Covid-19 test to enter a committee hearing.
- · Public seating in the gallery will be limited to ensure social distancing
- Members of the public are required to have a wristband demonstrating a negative Covid-19 test to enter the gallery.







Plan Your Time



- Arrive early if possible.
- Set expectations
- Pay attention to the timing of floor debates
- Staying until the end of a committee can be very fruitful
- Be willing to sit in an office to wait for a legislator to return

Committee Hearings

Providing verbal testimony

You should try to arrive at the Capitol at least 45-1hr. before your committee hearing is set to start.



Signing up to testify

- House: Sign up at the electronic kiosks in the Extension
- Senate: Depends on the committee. Some use electronic kiosks, others use witness cards at the back of the committee room.



Do Your Research, Know Your Issue

- Have timely, up-to-date research on your issue.
- Know who on the committee already supports your bill
- Watch for "softballs"
- Know who is hostile to your bill.
- Bring others with you, especially those with a personal stake in the outcome

Babies and Children

- Bring your kids
- Spend the day, before or after your testimony, visiting offices
- Target the fence-sitters
- Children receive a lot of attention

Respect the Staff & Follow Up

- Staffers are the eyes/ears for the Legislators
- Set up meetings with legislators beforehand
- Try to meet the legislators, but always be willing to meet with a staffer
- Follow up after your meeting with promised information.
